President's Message Joe Dobrowolski

The Society is in for a major change. We have scheduled a **Grand Opening of the new History Center for May 8.** This will be in conjunction with the Fair Oaks Chamber of Commerce Mixer.

Recently the Fair Oaks Recreation and Park District voted to terminate the Society's use of the Fireside Room in the Clubhouse. This action requires that we remove our displays, photos, artifacts, boxes and furniture from the Fireside Room by May 1st.

The new History Center was designed for a more contemporary look, so only a few pieces of furniture will be brought over to house artifacts relevant to the current exhibits. Society members have packed up the artifacts and photos from the Fireside Room for relocation or storage. Items previously in the storage unit are being reviewed, consolidated, and in some cases, relinquished to make room for the additional storage. Also, some furniture will be offered back to the original donors or put up for sale. Lots of work to be done in a short time!

We plan to keep the History Center open five to six days a week for five to six hours a day. This will require paying docents to staff the Center. Members willing to do this would be our first choice. Otherwise, our intent is to hire community college students.

In reviewing stored materials we found some interesting items; for instance—two reels of movie film taken in the late 1950's. At our April meeting we'll show them. Come and see if you recognize anyone from a Halloween party at the Grange or participating in the Fair Oaks Fire District's Easter egg hunt.

The meeting was called to order by President Ralph Carhart at 6:30 p.m. A delicious potluck followed.

President Ralph then thanked the Blomquists for setting up the meal and the lovely snowmen decorations on the tables. He also thanked Tel Labelle for taking care of the membership name tags.

<u>Supplemental Nominating Committee Report</u>: Warren McWilliams from the nominating committee reported that Bob Vogel will accept the position of Treasurer. The membership then voted to accept this nomination.

<u>Installation:</u> Member of the Sacramento County School Board, Eleanor Brown then installed the following officers for the year 2013: President, Joe Dobrowolski,; Vice-president, Trude Vasquez; Treasurer, Bob Vogel; and Secretary, Vicki Walter.

<u>President's Report</u>: President Joe then announced there will be an opening of the new Gallery in April or May. He would like it to be open 5 days a week during the summer. <u>Gallery Update</u>: Past President Ralph Carhart reported that the Water Exhibit, "Nourishing the Dream" was almost ready to be reproduced. Drafts were on display tonight.

<u>Introduction of Guests & New Members</u>: Dale & Laura Fowler and Natasha & Toby Owen were introduced as guests. Doris and Bob Adams were introduced as new members.

<u>Program:</u> Trude Vasquez introduced Bob Rohwer, retired from Zerox, and very active in all the local railroad organizations. The topic of his talk was "Southern Pacific's Placerville Branch & McKeen Cars." He then gave a very interesting talk about the railroad and trolley systems that were built in our area between 1890-1915. Many of these systems survived until World War II. There is one remaining McKeen Trolley car left at the Nevada State Railroad Museum.

Straith Home Update

We last updated the Society on the Straith house in January 2011 just after it had been moved from its original location to a lot further back from the bluffs. Most of the rest of the year and much of 2012 was spent installing the infrastructure for all the lots in the parcel.



Beyond our best hopes, last year the home was purchased by a married couple— Tim Carmichael and Carmel Comstock— who have two young children and were scouting around for a place to raise their family. Carmel, a decorative designer who hails from five generations of Sacramentans, knew that Fair Oaks was a definite possibility. She wanted a place where her children could safely walk the streets, where neighbors would wave as she drove by, and where there was a sense of community among the residents. Doesn't that sound a lot like Fair Oaks?
