

MEMBER MEMORIALS

JIM STRENG, May 16, 1930 – June 1, 2023

Born in Scranton, Pennsylvania in 1930, Jim served the community tirelessly both vocationally and long into retirement. A Korean War veteran, long-time Fair Oaks resident, retired home builder, and Sacramento County Supervisor, Jim of Streng Brothers Builders left his mark on the area, building more than 3,800 mid-century modern homes throughout Sacramento and Yolo counties. He was awarded Superior California Builder of the Year in 1980, and inducted to the Builders Hall of Fame as well as voted Sacramento's Citizen of the Year in 1996.



A resident of Fair Oaks for over 60 years, Jim worked tirelessly to preserve and protect the American River Parkway. Recently, the Fair Oaks Park District honored him for his many years of community service with the opening of Jim Streng park in Fair Oaks. Jim and Mary Jo (his wife of 65 years) have long been members of the **Fair Oaks Historical Society**. We were fortunate to enjoy his company and expertise as the Guest Expert at the History Center's Welcome Hour event in May.

CAROL ANN CROWTHER, March 12, 1937 - June 16, 2023

Born in Bakersfield, California in 1937, Carol led a remarkable life marked by unwavering enthusiasm and dedication to the Fair Oaks community. Carol and Glenn (her husband of 46 years) raised their family in a little white farmhouse on a hill in Fair Oaks (where she resided for over 57 years). She earned an associates degree and worked as a dental receptionist for 26 years.

Carol actively supported the Fair Oaks community through her service to the Fair Oaks Historical Society, the Fair Oaks Foundation for Leisure and the Arts, and the Fair Oaks Woman's Thursday Club. FOHS members will no doubt miss seeing Carol's kind and cheerful face at the Quarterly Meetings as she and Glenn served wine at those meetings. Consider raising a glass to toast her memory at the upcoming July Quarterly Meeting. Carol requested there be no memorial service and asked that in lieu of flowers donations be made to the student scholarship fund of the Fair Oaks Woman's Thursday Club or to the American Heart

Association.
