

For your convenience we have divided the tour into four “Loops”.


**Loop 1:** History Center Area

## The Fair Oaks Historical Society

was formed to preserve the history and heritage of Fair Oaks. The Society conducts research and records oral histories and has published a booklet: *The Early Years of Fair Oaks*, and has reproduced a 1900 map of Fair Oaks. Our History Center was established as a repository and museum of Fair Oaks artifacts.

### What we do:

- Protect and preserve historic documents, photos and artifacts related to Fair Oaks history
- Provide access to the public all materials in our collections
- Research questions from the public on Fair Oaks' history
- Maintain a History Center where the public can observe displays, photos, artifacts and documents and discuss questions with a trained docent
- Display videos and slide shows in a theater setting
- Provide access to over 800 historical Fair Oaks photos and assist local businesses and individuals in using the photos for displays
- Give talks on Fair Oaks' history to local civic and educational groups
- Conduct virtual and guided historical walking tours of the Fair Oaks Village and vicinity
- Conduct fundraisers and pursue grants
- Provide gift items of a Fair Oaks Historical theme
- Participate in community events such as the Chicken Festival, Fair Oaks Fiesta, Safe Halloween and Memorial Day
- Cooperate with other community services such as Parks, Rotary, Thursday Club, Sierra Chapter of the American Theatre Organ Society and others to promote the Fair Oaks community
- Maintain an online presence with a website and Facebook page devoted to Fair Oaks history




# ♥♥♥ Our Mission ♥♥♥



The Fair Oaks Historical Society and History Center are dedicated to collecting, preserving and presenting the historical record of Fair Oaks and its inhabitants.

*To accomplish this mission, the Fair Oaks History Center Will:*

- Preserve the historical record of the area known as Fair Oaks, California, 95628; that of its first inhabitants, the San Juan Rancho, the early settlers of the Sunset Colony and of succeeding generations.
- Educate the public on the history of Fair Oaks and its people through written, oral and media presentations, website publication and social media and respond to public inquiries regarding Fair Oaks History.
- Establish, operate and maintain an educational and research center and museum on Fair Oaks History for the benefit of the general public.
- Conduct research on the founders of Fair Oaks and the agricultural, civic, religious and cultural activities throughout its history and keep authoritative and permanent recordings of the facts in a repository.



571 Sunset Ave. Picture Date: 03/10/05  
Date of Construction: 1928

Farmer Bob's home, a familiar sight while driving on Sunset Avenue, was 2400 sq. ft. with a full basement. It had four bedrooms, two baths, a living and dining room, a breakfast nook plus the back porch.

Bob's parents bought the property as an orange grove in 1910. The elms in the yard were planted at that time. They lived in the "pioneer" home on the property until the new home was built when Bob was seven years old. Bob and Art Broadley built the home. Murray, another brother, was the plumber. The old home was torn down.

When Bob's parents passed away in the 70's, Bob and his wife bought his sister's interest in the house; they raised their daughters, Janice and Susan in the home. The sign at Farmer Bob's said established in 1975 for local produce and the best wagon rides before Halloween.



8150 Main St. Picture Date: Jan - 2006  
Date of Construction: 1922

This site was the General Store and first post office of Fair Oaks in 1865. The building was destroyed and the present home was constructed in 1922. Early occupants are unknown, but Glen and Lois Wright sold it to Larry and Dorothy Huggett in 1965. The detached garage was the site of an early repair garage.

The house, which has not been changed from its original structure, sits on a 1/2 acre lot. It has two bedrooms and a bath upstairs and one bedroom and a bath downstairs. It also has a basement.

The Huggetts raised four sons in their home. Dorothy's mother lived with them from September to May of each year for many years. The Huggetts had eight grandchildren who frequently visited when they were small.



3956 Villa Ct. Picture Date: Jun 2006  
Date of Construction: 1934

The architecture of this home has been retained. The main house has three bedrooms, two baths, a dinning room and a basement. There is a mother-in-law's quarters containing two bedrooms and one bath.

The owners have made major changes in the landscape including a beautiful swimming pool and terraced lawns. The large lot is canopied with massive oaks.

The former family, the Boldini's from Chicago, upgraded the kitchen during their ownership. It is said that the chandelier in the dining room came from Al Capone's home.
