

Old Homes of Fair Oaks The George Straith Home



- **Details:** Built between 1899 and 1900 by George Straith, a wealthy clothier from Chicago who moved to Fair Oaks to retire.

- **Restoration:** The Victorian manor was abandoned but was restored "from the ground up" by a local family (Tim Carmichael and Carmel Comstock) to match the original architecture while incorporating modern amenities.

- **Historical Context:** A 1890-1910 photo of the home is available in the *Center for Sacramento History Collection*.



The Fair Oaks Historical Society

was formed to preserve the history and heritage of Fair Oaks. The Society conducts research, records oral histories and publishes articles and original research of Fair Oaks. A recent booklet, *Fair Oaks Village Park - A Century of History* is now available. Our History Center was established as a repository and museum of Fair Oaks artifacts,




What we do:

- Educate the public on the history of Fair Oaks and its people through written, oral and media presentations, website publication and social media
- Publish quarterly newsletters
- Hold quarterly pot luck meetings with a guest speaker



Our Mission



The Fair Oaks Historical Society and History Center are dedicated to collecting, preserving and presenting the historical record of Fair Oaks and its inhabitants.



At the History Center

- We protect and preserve historical documents, photos and artifacts related to Fair Oaks history.
- We conduct research on the founders of Fair Oaks and the agricultural, civic, religious, and cultural activities throughout its history and keep authoritative and permanent recordings of the facts in a repository.
- We provide access to the public for research of all materials in our collection .
- We research questions from the public on Fair Oaks history.
- The public can observe displays, photos, artifacts and documents and discuss questions with a trained docent.
- We display videos and slide shows in a theater setting.
- We provide access to over 800 historical Fair Oaks photos and assist local businesses and organizations wishing to display historic material.
- We have gift items and Fair Oaks themed merchandise.

During this last year at the History Center

- We have purchased archive quality containers for storage.
- We are converting our spreadsheet based inventory system to an internet accessible, standardized, archiving platform called CatalogIt. This will allow broader access to Fair Oaks History with Cloud storage backup safety.
- We maintain and upgrade, where necessary, History Center equipment and facilities.

Old Homes of Fair Oaks

D. D. Dickson Home



Previous Owners:

Comments: The original 20 acre property ran east to Kenneth Avenue and south to Winding Way. Mr. Dickson was from Missouri. He was an orchardist until his Citrus was wiped out by the freeze in the early 30's. The original home was on this site but in 1903 -1906 he built the home that is standing today. The house is 5,663 sq. ft. which includes a very large basement and an attic room. He made the bricks that the house is built of by using a mold and cement. The pool is possibly the first pool in Fair Oaks which was built in 1938 with a pool house near by. The pool is fully tiled.

Leo Malek, second owner, subdivided 18 acres. He is the owner that built the 40 foot long, 11 foot deep pool. The third owner, R.F. Richardson, built a wrap-around porch and reconstructed the roof line.


The next owners were Don Kenmonth and Jennifer Miller who remodeled the kitchen, baths and attic while trying to maintain the integrity of the original home. They also restored the barn and pool house. Jennifer developed five lovely garden areas, one of which had a water feature.
